General Contractors

Full-service contractors specializing in commercial, industrial and institutional projects

Boilermaker Employing Contractors

Boiler contractors for schools, hospitals and power plants; and blast furnaces for heavy industry

Bricklaying Contractors

Brick, tile, terrazzo, marble, concrete and cement as well as cleaning, pointing, refractory and restoration contractors

Carpentry Contractors

General trade, acoustical and floor covering as well as a variety of specialty trade contractors

Cement Mason and Plastering Contractors

Contractors who employ finish concrete cement masons and plasterers

Construction Equipment Contractors

Heavy equipment contractors for cranes, dozers, scrapers, loaders, graders, backhoes and pavers

Construction Labor Contractors

Contractors who prepare/clean sites for buildings, highways, demolition & hazardous waste removal

Electrical Contractors

Residential, commercial and industrial electrical and communication contractors

Elevator Constructor Contractors

Elevator contractors who install, repair, and maintain elevators, escalators, and handicap lifts

Fire Protection Contractors

Contractors who employ sprinklerfitters, who install fire protection systems of all kinds

Glass and Glazier Contractors

Contractors who work mainly with glass

Industrial Mechanic Contractors (Millwrights)

Industrial mechanic contractors who install, test, remove, repair and service a wide variety of industrial machinery and equipment

Insulation and Asbestos Contractors

Thermal insulation, prefabrication, energy conservation and thermal efficiency contractors

Mechanical Contractors

Plumbing, pipefitting, steamfitting and mechanical service trade contractors

Painting Contractors

Contractors who employ painters, paperhangers and drywall finishers

Roofing Contractors

Roofing/waterproofing contractors for hot built-up or single-ply roofs; also shingle, tile, & slate

Sheet Metal Contractors

Contractors for the heating, ventilating, air-conditioning and refrigeration industry

Structural Steel and Reinforcing Contractors (Ironworkers)

Erection of structural steel, reinforcing rod in concrete and welding fabrication contractors

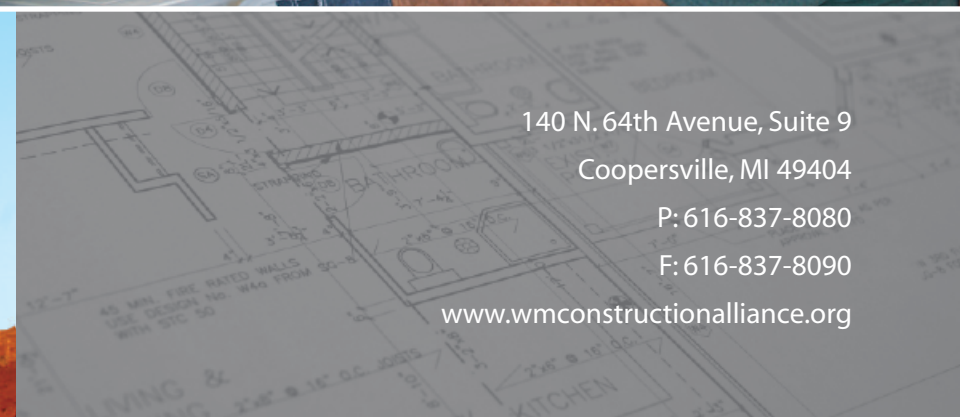

Apprenticeship programs span 4-6 years and 85% of the organized construction trades require an admissions test. Across all crafts, WMCA members spend over half a million dollars annually on training plus additional funding for:

- Confined Space training
- Mandatory & Voluntary Drug Testing
- Federal Bureau of Apprenticeship & Training Recognized Apprenticeship Programs
- Ongoing Journeymen Upgrading
- Mandatory CPR and First Aid Instruction
- Welding Certifications
- HAZMAT (sub part R training)
